



Since Term 1 of the Academic Session of 2023/2024, the curricular focus points on Creativity, Collaboration, Critical Thinking, and Communication were emphasised in every classroom and every lesson. In this Term 2, we are rolling out in stages for the last C, which is Character through our weekly learning assemblies. Character refers to their ability to empathise with others and apply that information to their behaviour. Often referred to as emotional intelligence, this C is the foundation for creating positive, meaningful relationships. In addition to academic skills, students should also possess emotional intelligence, grit, perseverance, an intrinsic desire to learn, and the capacity to empathise with others.

Character education is part of what good schools and teachers do naturally. As character is largely caught through rolemodelling and emotion contagion. Character should also be taught. By making character education explicit, students are provided with the rationale, language, and tools to develop their character. We should aim to develop confident and compassionate students who are effective contributors to society, successful learners, and responsible citizens. This is obviously a process that will need to happen over years and not just class periods. Students need to grow in their understanding of what is good or valuable and their ability to protect and advance what is good. All the 5 cross-curricular focus points: Creativity, Collaboration, Critical Thinking, Communication, and Character we are developing are referred to as the 5C's of UCSI Schools' 21st Century Learning.

Since last month, our students have been busy preparing themselves in the district sports competition (Majlis Sukan Daerah Wilayah Persekutuan Kuala Lumpur). We hope that they are filled with a sense of pride and accomplishment after participating in the district sports competition. 







