We are proud to share that Sekolah Menengah Sri UCSI Kuala Lumpur is selected to participate in the Malaysia Future Leaders School (MFLS) Programme. With a tight and stringent process, only 6 private schools in the state of Selangor and Kuala Lumpur are selected for this year, and only 50 private schools are selected throughout Malaysia, including Sabah and Sarawak. MFLS is a programme designed by the Institute of Leadership Excellence and Development under the Ministry of Youth and Sports and its strategic partners such as the Ministry of Education (MOE) and Outward-Bound School. he programme aims to highlight young people's potentials as strategic partners in developing the country based on the Federal Constitution and the principles of Rukun Negara. articipants selected will be allowed to participate in training and internship programmes in and outside the country apart from the chance to undergo in-house training and attachments at Government-Linked Company (GLC) and private companies. Additionally, participants are also offered a mentor-mentee programme with influential icons such as Ministers and Corporate members. Sekolah Sri UCSI Kuala Lumpur will be closed for Term 1 break from 29th May – 2nd June. We will observe a public holiday for Hari Keputeraan Yang Dipertuan Agong on 5th June. Therefore, Term 2 of the Academic Session starts on Tuesday, 6th June 2023.




