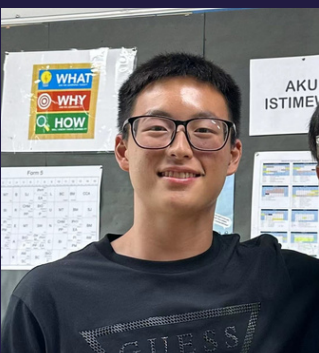

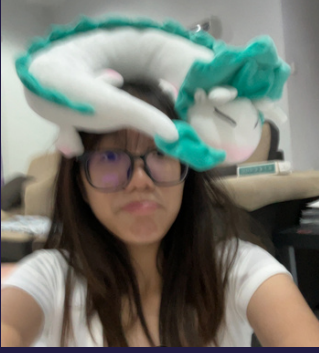

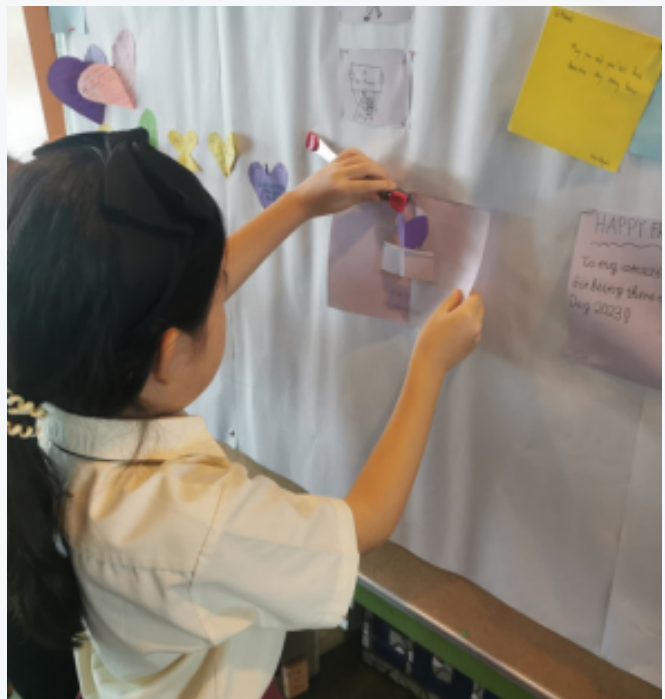
REPORT CARD DAY

PHOTOGRAPHY & DRAWING COMPETITION

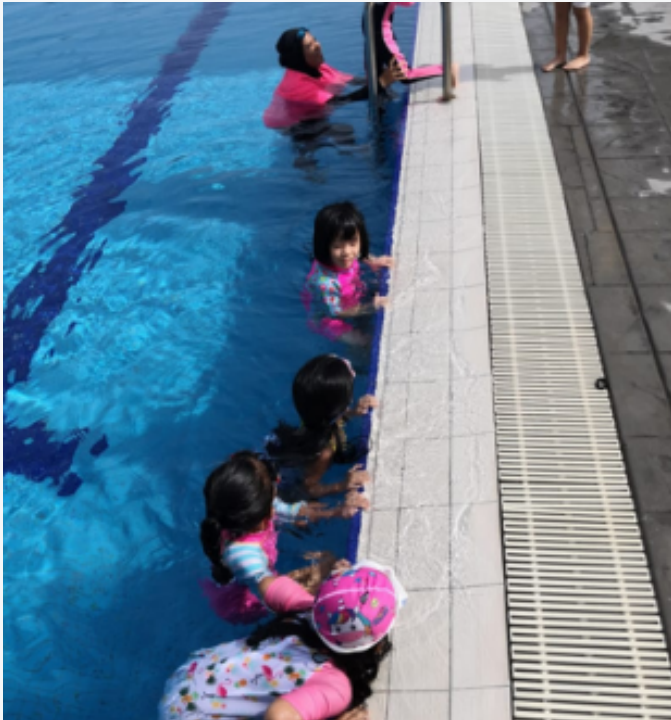

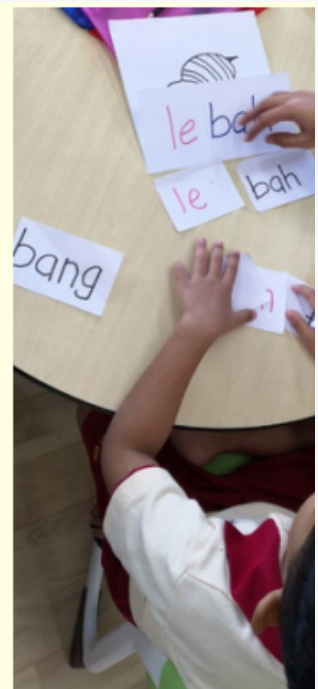
Pool Safety and Precaution

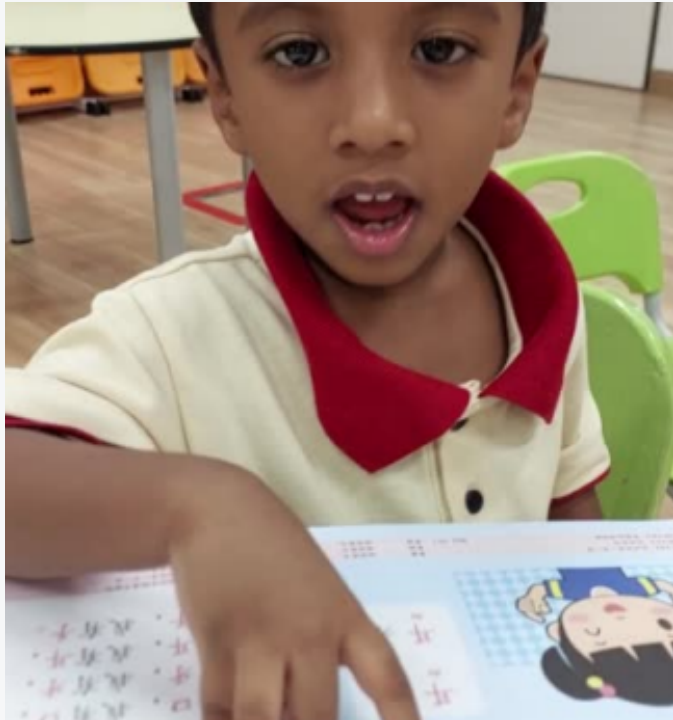
Learning Syllable

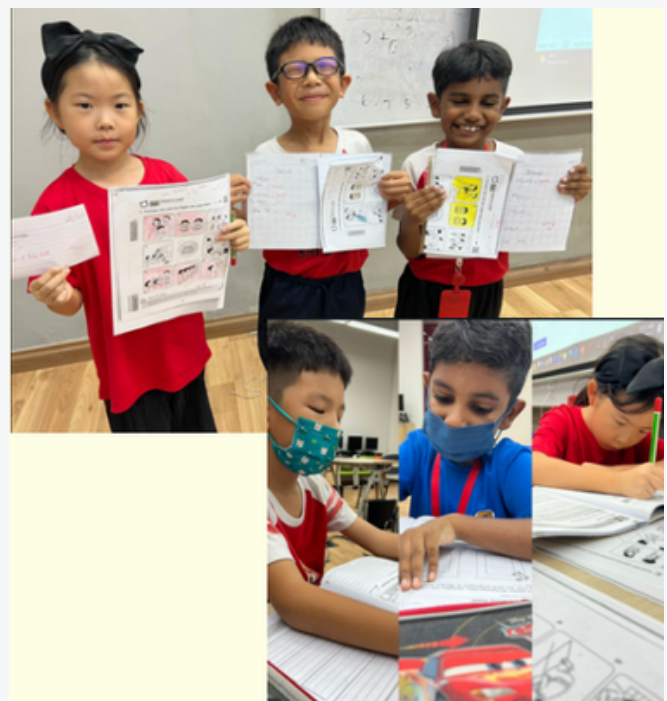
Merdeka Project With Std 6

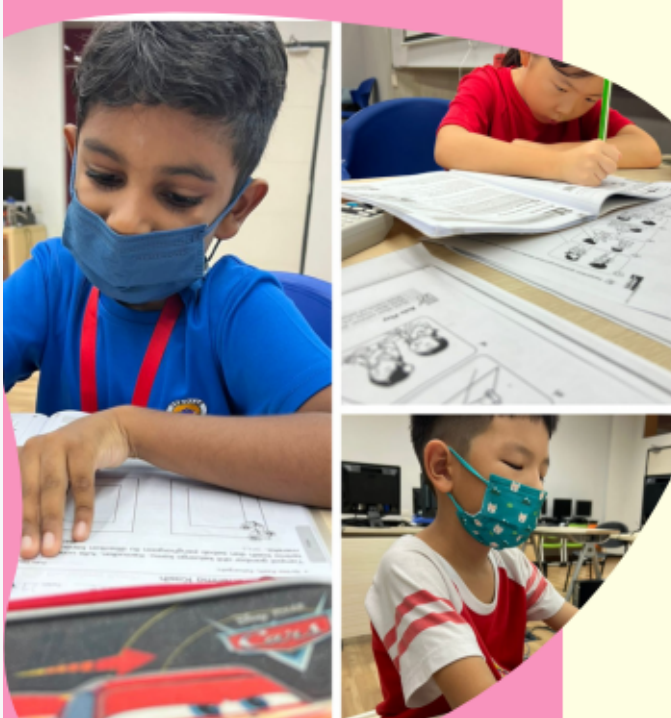
GYMNASTIC: A FUN WORKOUT

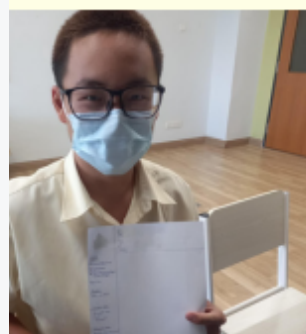
History - Gallery Walk

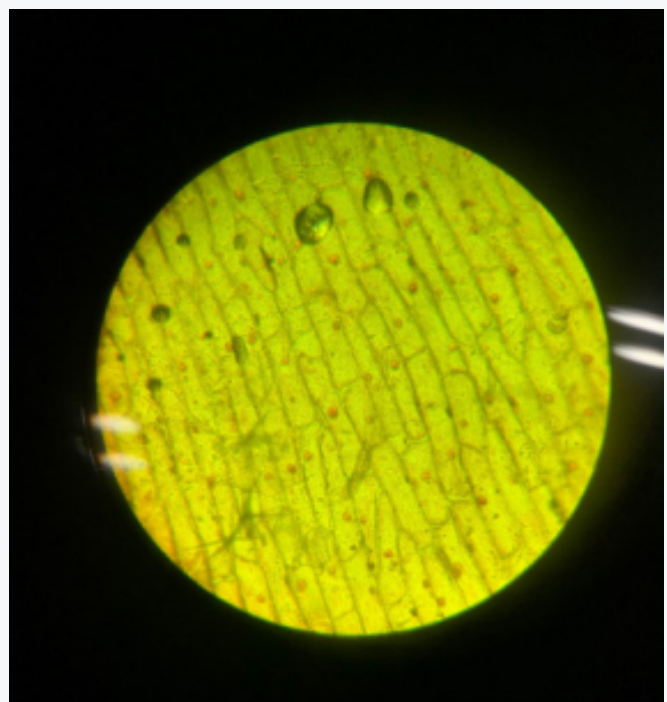
Newton's Law



"Physics is all about Newton's Law of Motion !" Form four students conduct an experiment to prove Newton's First Law of Motion on inertia. They establish a relationship between inertia and mass, demonstrating the law's validity. This simple experiment enhances understanding, while fostering creativity, critical thinking, and character education among the students.

Cell Organisation

Students of form 4 studied chapter 2 on cell organisation. They carried out an experiment to identify the structure of animal cell and plant cell. They used the microscope to view the animal cells and plant cells. Students used methylene blue and iodine as a staining agent. Students viewed the parts of the cells such as cytoplasm, cell membranes, cell wall and vacuole also.





Mandarin Oral Test (Form 4)

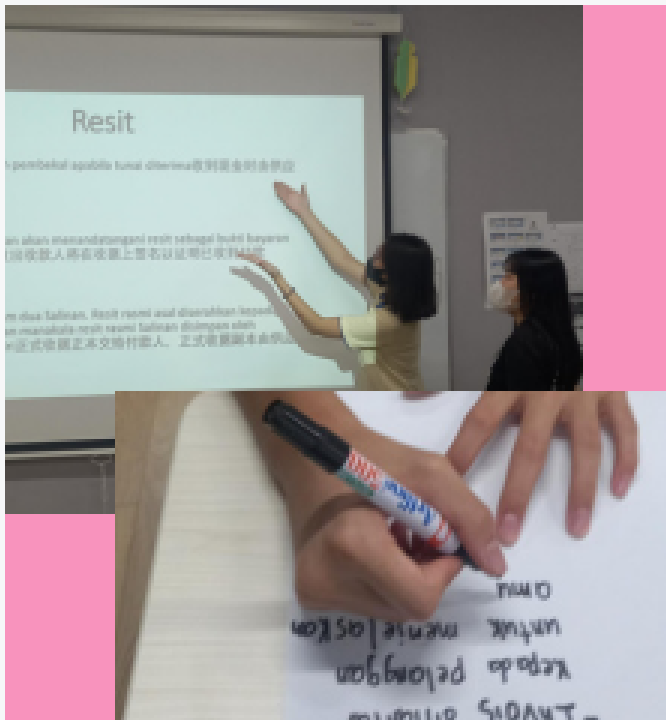
Form 4 : Basic Economic Problem Solving by Economic Systems: A Comparative Study of North Korea and Japan
