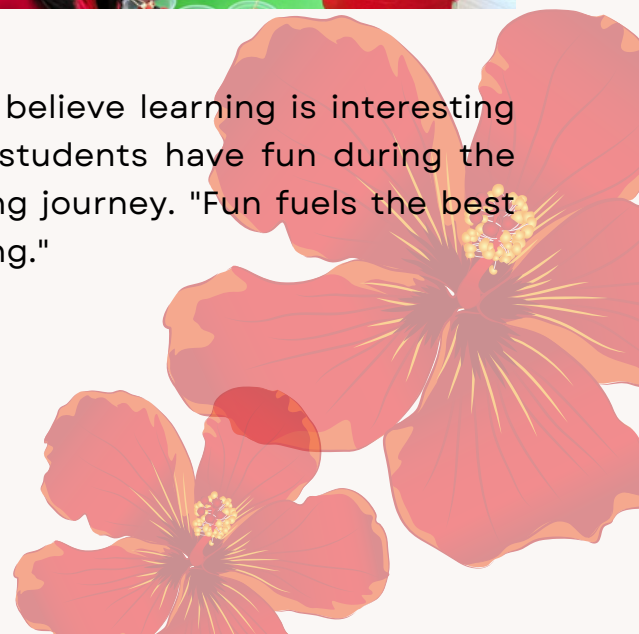
Aims and Goals

HISTORY LESSON FOR PRIMARY

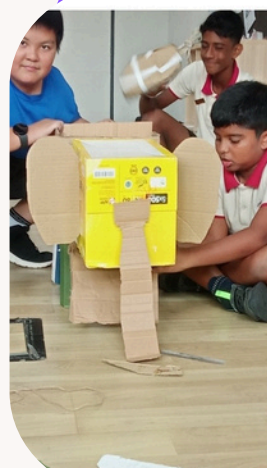
Children love stories, and history is full of fascinating tales, thus the teacher would pick a few age-appropriate historical stories that are engaging and have clear morals or lessons. To make the lesson more efficient, The teacher will do more interactive activities like role-playing, where students dress up and act out historical scenes. Building models: here students create simple models of historical landmarks or artefacts with craft supplies. The teacher will also relate the lesson to their world; historical events or figures to the students' own lives. For example, if you're talking about ancient civilisations, compare how their communities might have been similar or different from today.

Primary students are usually visual learners, thus the teacher uses lots of images, videos, and diagrams. The teacher will show pictures of historical artefacts, old maps, or famous paintings, and we will also watch short clips on educational videos that depict historical events or daily life in different periods.
