The workshop concluded with a “Story Circle” where students presented their insights, receiving applause and encouragement from peers.



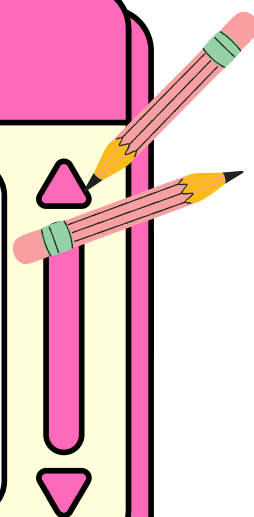
As storytelling continues to be an essential tool in education and beyond, workshops like this not only entertain but empower. The school looks forward to making storytelling a regular part of its learning journey

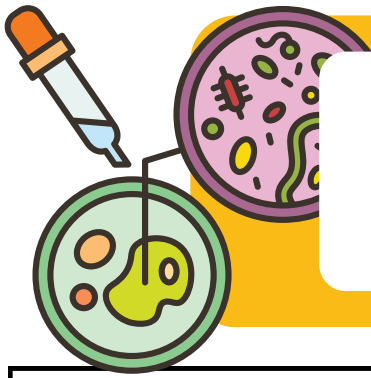

# SECONDARY LEARNING ZONE



## FORM 2: GEOGRAPHY- CONCEPTS OF ABSOLUTE AND RELATIVE DISTANCE.

In this group activity, Form 2 students explored the concepts of absolute and relative distance as part of the Geography topic on "Location". Students required to record the distance from each member's home to the school using digital tools such as Google Maps or Waze. This measurement represents the absolute distance, which is the actual physical distance in kilometers or meters. Additionally, students recorded the relative distance, which refers to the time taken to travel to school, along with the mode of transport used, such as walking, taking a bus, or using a car or motorcycle.



After compiling their group data, they analysed it to identify who lives the farthest, who takes the most time to arrive at school, and how different modes of transport affect the time taken. This activity allows students to apply geographical concepts to real-life situations while developing skills in data collection analysis, collaboration and communication.
