
### Rally for Glory: School Teams Clash in Volleyball MSSD Tournament


This type of multi-sensory learning helps children in retaining information better, feeling more confident in problem-solving, and staying engaged through purposeful play.

### Standard 1 Mathematics: Learns Number Bonds Using Real-Life Objects!"

Our Standard 1 students had a fantastic time exploring number bonds through hands-on activities using real-life objects! Instead of just looking at numbers on a page, our little learners were able to physically build number combinations with items they interact with every day. By using bottle caps, pencils, rubber bands and even paper cups, students worked in pairs to break numbers down into parts and understand how different combinations make up the same total.

At the end of the lesson, students managed to improve number sense and understanding of mathematical relationships, increased engagement and excitement about math, development of problem-solving skills through visual and tactile methods, and strengthened critical thinking as they work with real-world objects.
