


My journey at Sri UCSI has been deeply rewarding. The students here are hardworking and resilient, a reflection of the high expectations set by their families.

BRINGING HISTORY TO LIFE

In our recent Mandarin lessons, our Form 4 students embarked on a creative journey to explore and present famous historical Chinese stories. Working in small groups, students chose a well-known tale, researched its significance, and reimagined it through either a hand-drawn comic strip or a short film, complete with subtitles. This project aimed to help students not only deepen their understanding of Chinese culture but also strengthen their creativity, critical thinking, and collaboration skills.

Throughout the process, students took ownership of their learning by writing scripts, planning storyboards, and bringing their ideas to life through illustrations or video production.

Many groups took the initiative to seek feedback during informal checkins and continued refining their work outside of class time.
